Commercial & Residential Energy Audits

The ATA conducts commercial and residential energy audits for clients of all types and sizes, including private business, local and state governments, community organisations and individual households.

In early 2010, and in response to significantly high electricity bills at a number of their racetrack venues, Country Racing Victoria (CRV) engaged the ATA to undertake a detailed energy audit of 30 of its 60 racing venues across regional Victoria.

The ATA developed a tiered assessment methodology that delivered detailed on-site audits for approximately half of the required venues, with the remainder subject to desktop billing analysis and interviews of venue management personnel regarding on-site technology, infrastructure and behaviour.

In late 2012, ATA worked with the Uniting Church in Victoria and Tasmania to understand how, through energy efficiency, the organisation might be able to work towards a 20% energy and carbon reduction target by 2020.

ATA undertook audits at a range of representative UCA sites including churches, schools, aged care facilities and commercial offices to understand the most cost effective opportunities for action.

ATA has also undertaken many residential energy audits at single homes and for residential organisations over two decades. In early 2014, the ATA audited six homes for the Northcote Regional Housing Cooperative, in order to understand bill management, efficiency and solar opportunities – in the context of the Coop potentially becoming an exempt retailer in the energy market and taking over energy bill management and capital investment on behalf of the organisation's tenants.

Through all our auditing work, ATA delivers comprehensive recommendations to the client, including detailed technical and financial analysis, as well as behaviour change and billing and tariff management that sees clients significantly cut their electricity costs and carbon footprint into the future.
